Does your child use the internet and smartphone appropriately?

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Children are getting more exposure to information devices in their daily lives and studies. Giving children the ability to use it effectively without being distracted by the fun of the moment or the immense amount of information right in front of them.

In order for this generation to live in an instantaneous information society, it is necessary for families to improve information literacy and provide appropriate support for their children as they grow up. We will introduce the basic points on how to use the Internet safely and the impact of smartphones on children's academic performance.

How to use the Internet safely

Confirm that the URL starts with https * This can be checked in the URL field of the browser https is a more secure Internet Protocol than http, and this reduces the risk of harm

Check "About Us (operating company)" in the website to confirm that the website is not fake

When your child uses the Internet set up a filtering system

Expand the range of websites your child can access gradually as they grow up




Smartphones and Academic Achievement

In recent years, research by neuroscientists has revealed a correlation between the amount of time spent on smartphones and academic performance. As you can see in the figure on the right, the longer the time spent on the smartphone, the lower the average score, and the average score (A) of "children who study for more than 2 hours but use their smartphone for

more than 4 hours" is lower than the average score (B) of "children who study for less than 30 minutes but do not use their smartphone". This result tells us that it is strongly recommended that children use their smartphones for no more than **one hour a day** for whatever reason. Since there are some applications on smartphones that are useful for learning, it is important to start thinking about how to interact with smartphones at home so that children can learn how to use them in a moderate and useful way.

While the family was living apart, the COVID-19 pandemic made it difficult to travel between the two countries. This is one of the reasons why the family decided to move to Singapore where their father lives.



- What are you looking forward to in Singapore?

Considering the importance of spending time together as a family, we decided our entire family should move to Singapore, where her father is now working. We hope that this experience will be a good opportunity for our children to learn another language. She has always been shy in front of others and reserved in expressing her opinions, but as she has encountered various new experiences, she has gradually gained confidence and has the strength to tackle new things with a positive attitude. We want to enjoy exploring this new place with our children and giving them more chances to try new things by going abroad.

Please tell us about the Chinese lessons that S-chan is taking to prepare for life in Singapore.

She became interested in Chinese and started learning it because her father is working in Singapore. In Singapore, Chinese is used as much as English, so she is very motivated to learn Chinese because "she wants to go there and try to speak Chinese". The lessons are taught in English to learn Chinese. She decided to take the one-on-one course. While maintaining her English skill, she can feel the connection between English and Chinese expressions. We believe that it is a fulfilling language learning experience for her. The teacher said that she is learning Chinese quickly. Perhaps it is because she has been exposed to two languages since her early childhood.



Our daughter entered Kinder Kids from the Nursery class. We are very happy with the excellent curriculum and the education she received from Kinder Kids. 
