Learning Japanese at Kinder Kids

In our Japanese Learning classes, available from K1 class (Nen-sho), we help children who are accustomed to school life in English make a smooth transition to regular elementary school life. Among all our schools, more than 1,000 children are now taking this course.

Starting this school year, the classes have been changed to be held in the morning at the K1 level. We start the class by saying to the children "Ohayo-gozaimasu" (Good morning in Japanese) when their parents bring them to school. In this way, we help young children ease from leaving their Japanese speaking parents and entering the English speaking school environment. Also in the morning when their brains are more active, it makes learning Japanese and the smooth transition to English easier. Kinder Kids uses a unique age-appropriate curriculum that teaches "reading/writing/math" not only in English but also in Japanese. Children also learn about Japanese culture and study as a group through poetry, haiku and picture books.

Support at home: Reading to children

A mother tongue cannot exist without the acquisition of both "spoken" and "written" language. In particular, school textbooks use "written" language with a subject and predicate.

Picture books are the best material to develop this written language ability. In the nursery and toddler age group, children love to read one of their favorite books over and over again rather than reading a variety of books. Mom and Dad must have had their own favorite book at the same age. You may wonder if it's okay to read the same book all the time, but they may feel comfortable to hear the story with every word they remember. Please praise them for their increased memory to boost their self-esteem.

After the stage of increasing the number of favorite books to read, when they move on to Kinder level, they will need to read a variety of books. Thinking about the information

acquired from reading through "Input" and "Output" help children develop their reading skills. Even if they are able to read books on their own, please continue to read to them. It is important to read books by themselves, but they still enjoy hearing stories and increasing their imagination. Reading aloud is also effective in relieving stress for both mom and dad. We hope you and your child will enjoy reading aloud together.

How I understood the questions

Whenever I have questions, I looked up the questions at home. I asked my mother to describe things in an easy-to-understand manner while reviewing the Kinder Kids textbooks or looking at pictures in books or online. I also talked about the world news with my family.

Family Support

I taught him how to use the computer, how to answer questions and how to write his name in Kanii for the S-CBT exam. I let him do what he wanted to do before studying and I tried to help him start with questions he was good at so that he could enjoy studying proactively. I tried not to miss any progress he made, even if it was small, I praised him. I consciously watched over him or gave him advice.

I picked up a few topics that were easy to write about. I memorized English sentence templates and practiced writing my original sentences based on the sentence structure. I practiced keeping the same number of words on a line so that I could keep track of the total number of words while writing. I and my mother decided how to remove and expand sentences with detailed explanations so that I would not have to rewrite from scratch if I ran over or under the number of words.

Please take a look at some of the features of this more convenient test and the comments we received from the family.

Key points of the Eiken S-CBT

For Grade 3 / Pre-2 / 2 / Pre-1

O Completed in one day

The Eiken S-CBT is a one-day test that measures all four skills without dividing into the first and second tests.

Many test dates available

Generally, Eiken S-CBT tests are held every Saturday and Sunday. Since there are more test dates available than in the past, you can take the test on any day that suits your schedule.

The Eiken S-CBT does not have an environment or support system that is designed for young children to take the test. They take the test on the same floor with other examinees. My son was sometimes free to act in a group at school. For this reason, we checked the S-CBT website to see the flow of the test and the venue beforehand. decided what to do if he finished earlier than the designated test time or if he wanted to go to the bathroom during the test. I also told him not to touch anything /

on the computer not related to the test even if he was bothered by something. etc.....over and over.

This time, he was more motivated because he passed his first choice of elementary school entrance exam. I believe that what he learned in preparing for the exam, such as understanding and keeping promises. also helped him in the Eiken S-CBT test. He practiced and learned how to use the computer with a trial version on the
