The senior high school of Infinity International School opened in 2019. We will open an elementary school and junior high school in April 2022, finally providing an integrated global education for preschool, elementary, junior and senior high school students.

Kinder Kids will manage the Infinity International Elementary School!

Nurture children who enjoy their happy life anywhere in the world

About 20 years ago, I looked for an international school or an English school for infants as "I wanted to raise my child as a bilingual citizen of Japan" but I couldn't find one in line with my expectations. Then, I thought "If there isn't one, let's make one!"....This is the story about how Kinder Kids was established.... After graduating from Kinder Kids, my three children advanced to public and private elementary schools. As I watched them go through their education, I began to wonder about the education in Japan, such as "Why can't children acquire enough academic skills to pass entrance exams just by studying at school?", "Will studying only for tests be useful in society?", "Can we better nurture the skills only humans have?" and "Are there any schools where children can learn what is useful in society?". So, just as when I established Kinder Kids. I thought "If there isn't one, let's make one!" and decided to pursue to /

establish an elementary school.

We are trying to create a school where children grow up to be Japanese who in the future are accepted all over the world. The elementary school will focus on eight educational programs based on the philosophy of "enjoying a happy life anywhere in the world".

Unique Educational Programs

- Multilingual education in English,
 Japanese and Chinese
- 2 Skill-based individual and group with no grade level class distinction
- 3 Subject-based teacher assignment and tutor support system
- 4 Project-based learning
- Reading enhancement program
 (extensive reading, speed reading,
 English/Japanese/ Chinese
 reading comprehension)
- 6 History, geography and social studies through traveling
- 7 Lessons using ICT
- 8 Money-related education

What is no grade leveling?

We take the advantages of both individual and group learning in lessons.

In basic learning, depending on whether children are good at a subject or not, they are able to advance without being bound by a specific grade level curriculum or improve their academic ability by "Optimal Learning" with tutors' support to learn at their own pace until they fully understand. This is the basis of individual learning.

On the other hand, group learning is achieved by different grade levels studying together. The goal is to "learn from each other" by older children teaching younger children or working on the same project together. This helps children develop leadership skills and a sense of self-worth, and accelerates the learning process compared to learning only with children of the same grade level.

Each child's infinite potential

Our goal is to complete the six years of basic learning required in public elementary schools in about two years.


The time created can be used to optimize individual learning and each child will set their own learning goals and plans, such as inquiry-based learning, programming, science and preparation for junior high school entrance exams.

By working closely with each child's abilities and aptitudes, they will be able to achieve their goals and make their six years more meaningful.

World-class language skills

The children who enroll in our school have spent the critical period for language acquisition at preschool. They will continue raising their English to the level of a British elementary school graduate while living in Japan. In addition, they will learn Chinese over the next six years, aiming to acquire another world-class language.

Learning through practice

We help children "Explore to learn(Inquiry-based learning)" through traveling around the 47 prefectures to nurture their multifaceted thinking and decision-making skills by being able to apply their knowledge and findings in history, geography and social studies. We also provide "money-related education" where children can learn how to calculate income and expenses and marketing through actual experiences by creating their own currency and using it within the school.



The world is changing rapidly. At Infinity International Elementary School, we have developed a program to provide children with the necessary educational system so that they will not be left behind the times. Our goal is to provide a true education that will allow children to freely create their own future, without being bound by the standard elementary school education system in Japan today.

When I was a first grade in high school, I participated in the "Global Youth Conference", a program sponsored by the YMCA. It is a global event where people of the same age group gather from all over the world. Starting with cultural exchanges, we deepened our understanding of the SDGs, the common global goals by exchanging opinions and learning about the issues.

Taking advantage of this opportunity, a volunteer group (ICS: Impact Citizens for SDGs) was set up to plan and produce a daily calendar to increase understanding of the SDGs and distribute them to nearby junior high schools. The reason why I wanted to attend this school was because it was an accredited school where I could obtain an International Baccalaureate. The math, biology, and chemistry classes taught in English were difficult, but they were rewarding because the classes were explained in an easy-to-understand manner when I asked questions.

School life is more liberal and open-minded than at other schools.

Students are free to dye their hair, wear makeup and nail polish, and have piercings.

There were basic principles regarding safety, human rights, and bullying and other detailed rules were established based on student opinions. We had plenty of time for discussions, and I think it was a privilege for the first-year students to have their own opinions and listened to the opinions of others to come up with answers.

In such an environment, I realized the importance of the purpose of going to school, studying together, listening to and respecting the feelings and opinions of others. I am proud of being a first year student at my school!
